Is being held over the Easter holiday's 13 – 16 April2001, at Bowraville NSW (midway between Brisbane and Sydney).

Proposed events for 2001 A Medieval Odyssey include:

Combat - Gladatorial, Field Battles, Darkages, Crusader, Fort Battles, Combat Archery Archery - Master, Journeyman, Novice Levels

Workshops - Blacksmithing (from a professional practicing blacksmith)

Casting - Anders Soderberg, Archaeologist, living in Stockholm, Sweden

The casting method taught covers from the bronze age right through to late medieval. Casts maybe taken from actual artefacts that Anders will be bringing with him, or you can try your own design. The workshop will span the four days, but most time will be required on the first and last day, that is, the Friday and Monday (a consideration for those who may have to leave early Monday). In between these days the moulds will be drying. May also do some lectures.

## Guest Speaker(s) - Associate Professor Dan Carlsson

Associate Professor Dan Carlsson is an associate professor at the Visby University. He is a co founder of Viking Heritage and current president of that association. He began his archaeological career excavating at Birka in Sweden and has been involved in many excavations since, Karelia, fjole and currently Frojel Harbour to mention a couple. He has also been consultant to many other excavations from the Iron Age to Medieval. He currently does lectures all over Europe and America. He has a very high opinion of Australian Re-enactors as you can see from his article on the Frojel home page. He is very much in favor of passing on knowledge to us because as he put it, "The archaeologist digs it up and the re-enactors make the object come alive as a living picture." Professor Carlsson will be conducting two lectures. These may be repeated if people miss out due to space. Professor Carlsson will also be bringing a number of artifacts with him.
