Hard Accommodation and Camping

Bright (6km from Porepunkah) and Myrtleford (the last major town before Porepunkah) Both of these towns have ATM's supermarkets, chemist, petrol etc...

Important Combat Information

Melee Weapons

- The maximum length for a spear used in 'Dark Ages and Medieval' combat will be 2.7
 meters.
- All weapons with metal edges shall meet the following requirements:
- metal edges shall be rounded to a minimum of 1.5mm diameter;
- metal points shall be rounded to a minimum of 20mm diameter (5 cent piece).
- Pikes and over long spears may only be used in 'latter period' combat.

Bows

- Long bows, short bows, and recurve bows made from wood, fibre-glass, or laminate may be used.
- Compound bows and take-down bows are not acceptable.
- Bows shall have a maximum draw weight of 30 pounds at 28 inches (30# @ 28").
- The bow shall have some form of permanent marking so that it may be readily identified with its owner. The owners initials are not acceptable.

Arrows

Arrows shall meet the following criteria:

- The minimum standard shall be a wooden shaft of 11/32nds of an inch diameter.
- Aluminium, fibreglass, and carbon shafts shall not be used.
- Arrows shall be a maximum of 28 inches in length as measured from the nocking point to the back of the rubber blunt.
- The end of the shaft which will be inserted into the rubber blunt shall have it's end rounded.
- It is recommended that shafts be taped with Scotch 898, or equivalent, fibreglass tape from the base of the fletching to the tip of the shaft.
- Each shaft shall be securely fitted with a rubber blunt.
- HTM and Riverhaven MKII style blunts shall be the preferred standard. Plastic blunts are not acceptable and shall not be used.
- Each shaft shall have some form of permanent marking so that it may be readily identified with its owner. The owners initials are not acceptable.

It has been brought to the committee's attention that as posted on the website Combat Rules
No weapon of any type, such as maces or flails, banned under the 'Control of Weapons
(Amendment) Act 1994 No.30 1994...

In recent discussions of Protection it has been proposed that minimum protection standards be adopted. These standards are *highly recommended* by the committee for all combatants. During the State of the Movement discussion a vote will be taken as to whether these standards should be required by all combatants. The standards are:

Minimum protection of a tunic or a linen shirt with padding, equal to at least 2 layers of good (Blanket thickness is recommended) wool, must be worn during organized combat. Protection is left to the participants in display combat

All combatants will be required to have all target areas covered by the above minimum protection. This excludes the lower leg as it is not a target area but does include the forearm and head. Shoes are also required.

How To Get There



From Sydney and all points north

Travel to Albury and take the Hume Freeway south, follow the "to Melbourne" signs, after the 1st Wangaratta exit, be in the left lane, take the "B500 Ovens Highway" turn left follow this to Myrtleford. (Continued below see From Myrtleford to Porepunkah). Wangaratta is the last big City for all you've forgotten.

From Adelaide and Mildura (Suggestion only, route not tested)

Take the Sturt Highway to Mildura. Take Murray Valley Highway to Echuca, and then follow either:


- a. Echuca to Shepparton to Benalla, (*last really big town*) turn left on to Hume freeway and follow from Melbourne instructions.
- b. Echuca to Yarrawonga to Wangaratta, (*last big City*) find the beginning of <u>"B500"</u> in centre of town and follow it to Myrtleford.

From Melbourne and all points south

Take the Hume freeway, After Glenrowan signs, be in left lane. 300 mtrs past a large Macdonalds, (easy landmark)(8 km from Glenrowan in the middle of nowhere) take the "C522 Milawa, Taminick" turnoff. NOTE (Should you miss the "C522" road continue on freeway after the 1st Wangaratta exit, be in the left lane, take the "B500 Ovens Highway" turn right, follow this to Myrtleford.)

Turn right, follow <u>"Milawa C522"</u>, at a dog leg cross road continue to follow <u>"C522"</u> This will bring you (through lots of wine country) to a "T" intersection, turn right on to <u>"B500 Bright, Myrtleford."</u>

Porepunkah



From Myrtleford to Porepunkah

Public toilets (red brick building, close to road) are in a small park on the right. Continue straight through Myrtleford (the last big town) on "B500 Bright Bairnsdale". The next town is Porepunkah well signposted on the approach

Do not go into Porepunkah town centre. Go over bridge (Ovens River) turn right at roundabout on to the "C535 Mt Buffalo" (3rd road around the roundabout) 6 km up this road is Noonameena Lodge. We suggest you note your mileage at the round-about and slow down after 5 km, as there is not much room to U turn with a trailer if you over shoot the turn off. Look for our signs, as there is not much else as landmarks. There is a Bus shelter (hiding behind a bush) on the right, and the blue road sign "Noonameena lodge" on the left, 30 metres before a large sign "Welcome to Mt Buffalo National Park". Turn right, just past the bus shelter, onto a very narrow 1-lane bridge, you've made it. Across the narrow bridge, turn left, take the right fork, and you should see our registration area in the rec.
