

HOW TO GET TO CONFERENCE...



If coming from Melbourne, turn off the Western Freeway at the Bacchus Marsh exit. You can go right into Bacchus Marsh main street, and turn left (south) into Grant Street at the second pedestrian crossing with lights (west end of the shopping centre, just before the road climbs); after 1.3km turn right at the roundabout by the school (don't cross the railway) and continue for 7.7km until you reach the signs to Rowsley/Glenmore and Lady Northcote Camp at the intersection marked signpost on the map.

If you want to avoid the main street of Bacchus Marsh, turn off earlier at Woolpack Road (sign to Geelong). SEE MELWAY MAPS 219 –220.

From Geelong, reach intersection sign post from the Bacchus Marsh – Geelong Road via Balliang East.

The campsite is 8km from the signposted intersection, on the south side of the Glenmore Road, just past the Spring Creek bridge. The entrance has a clear sign.

From Ballarat, the camp can be reached by leaving the Western Freeway just before Ballan at the 'Daylesford' exit, and getting on the road towards Mt Wallace, turning left on to the Glenmore Road.
